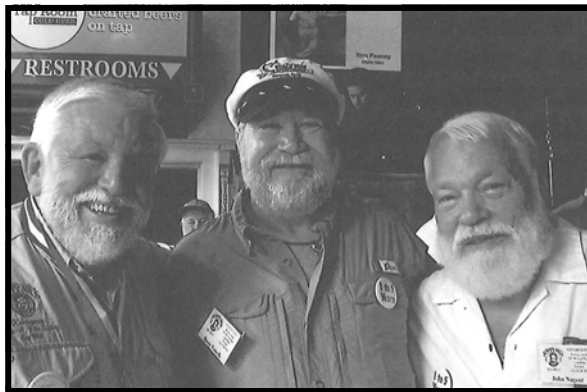
PAHS Members “In the News”
